Notes:

Types of challenges:

- Finding information: find a leaflet, sign, etc with specific information to answer a question about being a Journalism student (e.g. Career events, library resources)
- Interacting with tutors: meeting a tutor in a given location and engage in an icebreaker activity with them
- Fun activity: students posing or performing as a team

Categories for awards:

- Quickest group: the group that completed the route first (data from Qualtrics)
- Best detective: the group that found all the relevant information as well as the lie from their tutor (see below)
- Rising star: best selfie-takers and catwalk video!

Instructions for activities involving tutors:

• Truth and lies

Tell the students three facts about yourselves. One of them is a lie. Students question you to find out which one it is. Once they have found it, they record a short video presenting you using the information they know about you. Try and find three facts that are rather unusual/not too obvious

Example: I lived in Moscow for five years, I can speak three languages, I met Prince Harry at a party

• Things in common

Each member of the student group needs to find something that they have in common with you. It cannot be physical, I.e we both have blue eyes, wear green shoes, etc. They will need to ask you some questions. You may have to encourage them with prompts or ask them things yourself, too.

Each member writes down what they have in common with you on a piece of paper, I.e. "we both visited La Paz", "we both have two sisters" and then take a picture with you holding it.

• Interview

Each student needs to come up with a Wh- question that you will have to answer about yourself. They record themselves interviewing you in one go.
