Progress with the Pregnancy Circles Trial

We are excited that the first sites for the Pregnancy Circles Randomised Controlled Trial have now started recruiting:

September - Lewisham University Hospital; Queen Elizabeth Greenwich,

October - West Hertfordshire; Whittington Health (Whittington Team)

November – Whittington Health (Greenstone Team).

In mid-November over 90 participants had been recruited to the trial which is a great start – just over 2,000 to go! The first Circles have now commenced.
