
### Milestones achieved since March:

## What is SUPERB?

SUPERB is a **research study**

It aims to find out what helps people adjust and **get on with life after stroke and aphasia**

## Why are we doing the research?

People have **emotional needs** after **stroke** and **aphasia**

We **don't know enough** about these needs

We want to know what **helps people adjust**

## What will happen?

SUPERB researchers will:

- visit **60 people with aphasia** at home
- ask **questions** about how they are **feeling** and how they are **getting on** with things.
