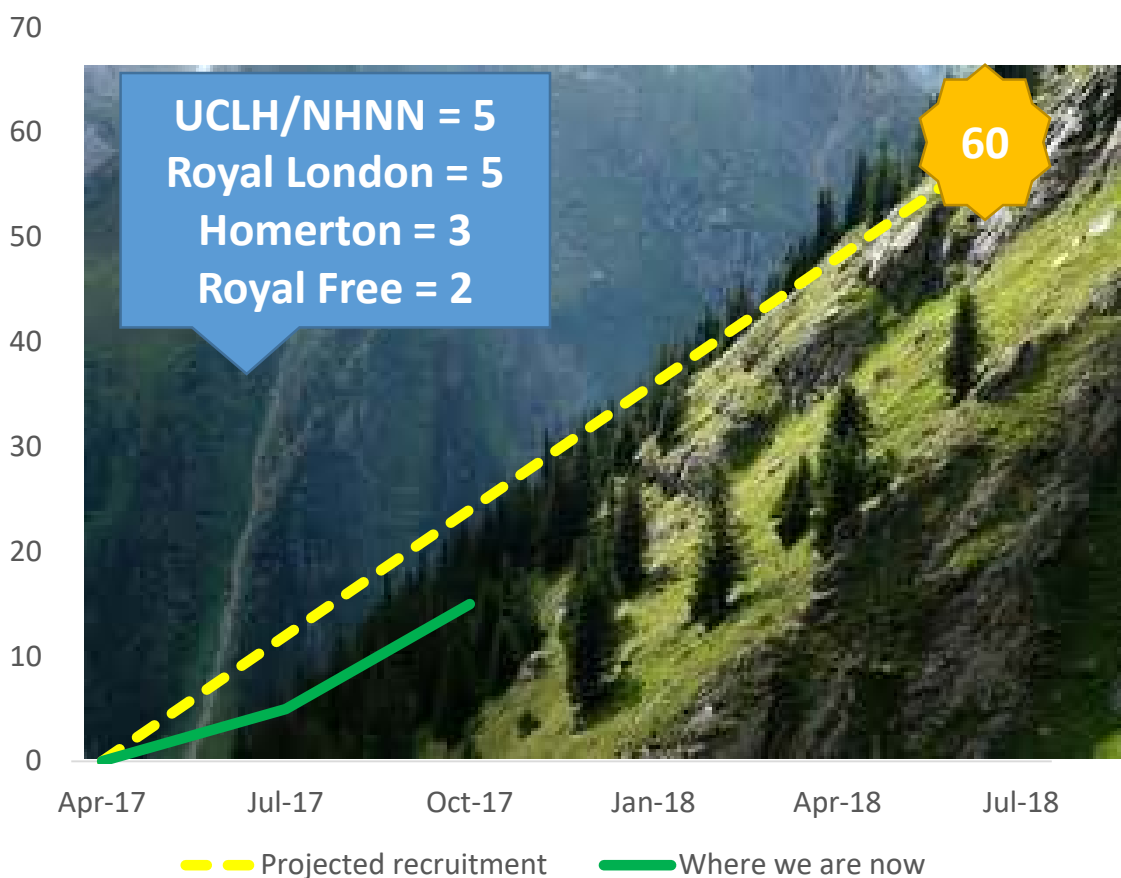


Milestones achieved since June:

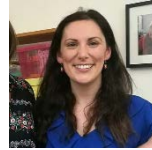

What is SUPERB?

SUPERB is a **research study** which aims to find out what helps people **adjust** and **get on with life** after **stroke and aphasia**

Why are we doing the research?

People have **emotional needs** after **stroke** and **aphasia**

We **don't know enough** about these needs and we want to know what **helps**

What will happen?

SUPERB researchers will:

- visit **60 people with aphasia** at home
- ask **questions** about how they are **feeling** and how they are **getting on** with things.

Who are we working with?

London boroughs of **Camden, Islington, Tower Hamlets** and **Hackney**

Five hospitals:

Homerton, National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery, Royal Free, Royal London, UCLH
