The Web Team is responsible for the development and support of the University web sites, online applications and the intranet. We work with University marketing team, schools, departments and centres to create useful, informative web sites for prospective and current students. We build responsive, accessible, and standards-compliant web sites, using modern technologies and according to best practices.

As Web Developer, you will work as part of a small team to develop and maintain University web sites and bespoke web applications, and provide support for content editors.

- Contribute to the development of the primary University web sites, including <http://www.city.ac.uk/> and <http://www.cass.city.ac.uk/>.
  - Provide second-line support for the University web sites, liaising with the IT Service Desk and content editors to resolve problems.
  - Support and develop other University web services and applications.
  - Work with University stakeholders to gather requirements, advise on web development best practices and contribute to project planning.
  - Work with specialist technical staff to ensure the smooth-running and availability of web sites.
  - Develop and maintain relevant skills and knowledge.
