

How to use these worksheets – Years 3-6

Resources:

These sheets can be printed off or viewed on a laptop, tablet or phone and the questions worked through. The child will need a pencil and a piece of paper.

Timings:

Where an adult is talking the worksheet through with a child each worksheet should take around 15-30 mins to complete. They are designed so that a child can work through them on their own but expect this to take longer and they may have questions or need to access the internet to help answer questions.

Worksheet 3 provides a platform for you to talk to the child about how they feel about leaving their primary school and moving to secondary school. Recognising and allowing children to feel emotions is important, let your child explain how they feel and then work with them to find the answers to the questions they have.
